RECOMMENDATION OF RULES
COMMITTEE TO ENACT RULE 46
OF MAGISTRATE'S RULES OF
DISTRICT COURT AND DISTRICT
COURT

O R D E R

The Rules Committee having duly petitioned this Court for the enactment of Rule 46,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the following Rule 46, Rules of Court for Magistrate's Division of the District Court and District Court be and the same hereby is adopted to read as follows:

After a plea or verdict of guilty, or after a verdict against the defendant on a plea of a former conviction or acquittal, the court must appoint a time for rendering judgment, and if requested by the defendant the time set for entering such judgment shall not be less than two days.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED That Rule 46 as adopted be and the same is hereby promulgated and adopted as a Rule of The Court for Magistrate's Division of the District Court and District Court, and that such Rule shall become effective November 21, 1972.
